# PRAYER Labyrinth



There are many ways to use this finger labyrinth: for prayer, discernment, healing and self-awareness. Some find the labyrinth to be especially helpful in times of loss and transition.

THE WAY IN: Release. In following the winding way in, you are invited to shed everything on your mind - your worries, fears, concerns. Let it all go. Start on the outside entrance to the labyrinth and use your finger to trace the path into the center.

AT THE CENTER: Receive and rest. Be still and wait for a sense of God's presence that may be a feeling, thought, image or a sense of peace. Take as much time as you need. Hold your finger in the center during this time.

THE WAY OUT: Return. As you slowly wind your way out, take note of God's presence as you integrate whatever you received or learned, as you return to the world. Trace the path back out the way you came in.
