CHRIST CHURCH UNITED METHODIST VIDEOTAPING WEDDINGS

The wedding ceremony is a sacred and important service of worship. With this consideration foremost in mind, Christ Church has adopted the following policies relating to the videotaping of weddings:

- Video cameras should be confined to the balcony during the wedding service. If a view from the front is desired, one <u>unmanned</u> video camera may be placed behind the pulpit, positioned low enough to be unobtrusive. There are <u>no other acceptable positions</u> for video cameras during the wedding ceremony. Attempts to use unapproved cameras could result in their removal from the sanctuary.
- 2. Videotaping must be done with "available" light. Supplemental lighting is not permitted.
- 3. Cables may not be placed on the floor or attached to the walls of the sanctuary. Any cables used by the videographer must be confined to the balcony or the choir loft out of sight of wedding guests.
- 4. Videographers should be appropriately attired for the wedding.
- 5. If the videographer desires direct audio pick-up of the pastor(s), wedding vows, solos, etc., advance arrangements should be made for securing an audio feed from the sound console.
- 6. If the videographer plans to utilize his/her own wireless microphone(s), these plans must be coordinated with the Sound System Chairperson in advance of the rehearsal to ensure that there will be no interference between the videographer's wireless mics and the sound system wireless mics. If this has not been done, the videographer's wireless mics will not be permitted.
- 9. The videographer may process down the aisle no further than six rows from the back.
